#### <u>Keizan Zenji's birthday</u> service

Our Soto tradition in Hawaii is traced back to our two founders, Dogen Zenji and Keizan Zenji. While both Dogen and Keizan will always be remembered as great teachers of Zen, Keizan Zenji is credited with initiating the rapid and wide spread growth and influence of Soto Zen throughout Japan. He laid the foundation for the development of Soto Zen by training many outstanding disciples who would propagate the teachings

Taiheiji strives to serve the social, spiritual, and religious needs of its members through its ongoing mission to provide a place where people are welcomed with open arms to receive the guidance of the Buddha Dharma.

We regularly receive requests from nonmembers for services. It is during these times when people know of no other place to go that they realize the importance of being a member of the temple. ## 2020 Fujinkai Dues

The Soto Mission of Aiea Taiheiji Fujinkai will soon be collecting Dues (\$10) for the year 2020. There are two membership options to choose from:

- Annual Membership: \$10/year
- Lifetime Membership (for current members of the Fujinkai with at least two years of active membership), based on age:
  - 50 and under \$100
  - 51-60 \$50
  - 61-70 \$40
  - 70 and over \$30

They help one another out in the time of need, and spend time together in fellowship at and outside the temple throughout the year. In addition to providing support for each other, the women of the Fujinkai take on added responsibilities. They make generous contributions to the maintenance and furnishing of the minister's residence, and purchase appliances for the temple. # 9TH U.S. SOTO ZEN MEMBERS CONFERENCE: LAS VEGAS



On Saturday, October 26, sixty-seven people from various temples and Zen Centers across the United States met at the Golden Nugget Hotel in Las Vegas for the Soto 9th U.S. Zen Members Conference. Four members from Taiheiji—Carl Kawauchi, Helen Tachino. Susan Teri Tachino. and



Wong—along with Rev. Shuji and Jaymie Komagata, were among the 33 people from Hawaii attending the one day conference.

After the opening ceremony, a special tribute was made in memory of the late Mrs. Faye Komagata, a driving force in Los Angeles during her youth and for many years in Hawaii. Flowers were offered, and everyone sat in a moment of silence honoring Rev. Shuji's mother.



The theme, "American Buddhism" was the focus of this conference. There were guest speakers and group discussions to discuss not only the challenges faced by many temples, but also the great progress being made across the United States in the development of the Soto Zen tradition. Ideas were exchanged, and everyone enjoyed the lively discussions.



This conference, last held in Hawaii in 2013, endured a six year hiatus—it was traditionally held every two years with the Hawaii and North American Bishop's Office taking turns as host—so it was nice that the North American office put this event together.
