An early invitation is extended to everyone to attend Taiheiji's annual Hanamatsuri and April Kannonko services, which will be observed on Sunday, April 21, at 9:00 a.m. Hanamatsuri, translated as "Flower Festival," is also known as Buddha Day. Hanamatsuri commemorates the birth of Siddhartha Gautama, the prince of the Shakya clan, a tiny kingdom in India, in 563 BCE. Prince Siddhartha would later become Shakyamuni Buddha. During the Hanamatsuri ceremony, amacha, or sweet tea, is poured over the statue of the baby Buddha that stands under the hanamido, a miniature pavilion covered with fresh flowers. Taiheiji's monthly Kannonko service will also be held after the Hanamatsuri ceremony. Please join us for service and refreshments to follow.
